STEPHEN SANFORD - ARTISTIC DIRECTOR, CHOREOGRAPHER

Stephen began his professional performing career with the Grand Rapids Ballet Company in 2001. As a principal dancer, he has collaborated with renowned choreographers and ballet masters from around the globe, including Francia Russell, Daniel Duell, Paul Boos, Mario Radacovsky, Kirk Peterson, Wes Chapman, Gordon Peirce Schmidt, Charthel Arthur Estner, and Olivier Wevers, among others. His repertoire spans classical and neo-classical works, with notable lead performances in George

Balanchine's iconic ballets such as *Apollo, Who Cares, Four Temperaments, Serenade, The Nutcracker, Valse Fantaisie, Rubies, Stars and Stripes, and Concerto Barocco* and Gerald Arpino's *Light Rain.* Stephen's talent has also graced numerous ballet companies as a guest artist, including New York Theater Ballet, Tulsa Ballet, St. Louis Ballet, Ballet Chicago, Geiger Ballet, Southold Dance Theater, and Ohio Theatre Ballet. In addition to his performing career, Stephen has dedicated over 25 years to teaching ballet. He has taught advanced and master classes at institutions like Grand Valley State University, Grand Rapids Ballet School, and currently for Ada Dance Academy, Ballet Chicago, and Deos Contemporary Company. Since 2015, Stephen has served as the Artistic Director of West Michigan Youth Ballet, guiding hundreds of young dancers and nurturing their passion for dance through productions like *Coppelia, Sleeping Beauty, Cinderella, The Nutcracker, Swan Lake,* and most recently, *The Wizard of Oz.* Beyond his artistic endeavors, Stephen cherishes his role as a family man. He and his wife, Jennifer, along with their five children—Julia, Andrew, Elaina, Nathan, and Lucy—are the heart of his life and inspiration.

My thanks to all the participating schools and teachers who provide love and care for these dancers and cultivate them to be passionate and educated about their craft. The caliber of WMYB productions are interconnected with our partnering schools who have honed the skills of their students and instilled a respect for the art-form. WMYB BIOGRAPHIES



LAURA SCHWENK-BERMAN - CHOREOGRAPHER

Laura Schwenk-Berman has been performing, teaching, choreographing, and staging works for over 45 years. She began her professional career dancing principal roles for the Garden State Ballet and subsequently danced with Chicago Ballet, Boston Ballet, and for seven years with the Pacific Northwest Ballet. There she performed as a soloist with Gelsey Kirkland and Mikhail Baryshnikov and danced in *Nutcracker: The Motion Picture*. She has toured as a guest artist throughout the United States, Europe, and Asia. Laura served as the Ballet

Mistress, Interim Artistic Director, Associate Artistic Director, and Director of the School of the Grand Rapids Ballet Company from 1992-2010. She conducted two capital campaigns, one to renovate the old North Star Bus Terminal into four beautiful studios and administrative offices; the second, to build the company's Peter Martin Wege Theatre and costume shop. At that time, GRB received the Governor's Arts Award for excellence and toured the Midwest and Canada, reaching an audience of over 500,000. As Director of the School of the Grand Rapids Ballet Company, she established the school's curriculum, syllabus, faculty, and performances, while placing students in ballet companies around the world. Laura has a Masters degree in Theatre from Northwestern University where she graduated with honors. Currently she works as a freelance artist, choreographing original works and staging full-length ballets, and as a guest master instructor and private coach. She also serves on the Advisory Board of the WMYB.

Laura choreographed the following *Wizard of Oz* scenes: Miss Pitt, Cyclone, Scarecrow, all Poppy and Emerald City scenes, Witch's Castle fight, and the Wizard/Dorothy departure scene on the amazingly talented dancers of the WMYB. They were her inspiration, along with the production's vastly creative artistic team.



HEATHER CASSADY - COSTUME DESIGNER, COSTUMER

Heather graduated from Michigan State University with a BA in Clothing and Textile Design with an emphasis in Fashion Design. She then began an 11-year career as a Costumer with the Walt Disney Company. She was the Costumer for a variety of parades and stage shows in all four of the Walt Disney World Parks and many of their resort properties. Some of her shows included the *Remember the Magic* Parade, *SpectroMagic, Around the World with Mickey and Minnie, Beauty and the Beast, The Jungle Book*, and several U.S. tours

and conventions. Heather was an integral member of the *Wizard of Oz* creative team. In addition to designing all of the production's costumes, she is a skilled dramaturge who contributed many creative story ideas. Heather would like to thank her children John, Katie, Joshua, Brandon, Katrina, and Nellie, and her first class husband, John.

YUKA OBA-MUSCHIANA - CHOREOGRAPHER, SOMEWHERE OVER THE RAINBOW

Yuka was born in Japan where she received her training from Hitomi Takeuchi Ballet School. In 2006, she attended English National Ballet School in the UK, graduating early in 2008. Mario Radacovsky invited her to join the Slovak National Ballet where she danced a variety of roles such as *Tchaikovsky Pas de Deux* by George Balanchine

and Spring lead lady in *Four Seasons* by James Kudelka. Yuka joined Grand Rapids Ballet in 2011 where she has since danced many principal roles. In 2013, Yuka had the honor of performing Olivier Wever's *The Sofa* at the Joyce Theatre in New York and reprised her role in Seattle. Yuka performed *Le Corsaire Pas de Deux* in the gala at The National Theatre in Tokyo and the *Pas de Deux* from *Le Carnaval de Venise* in Fukushima. In 2014, Val Caniparoli choreographed Clara on Yuka for the world premiere of *The Nutcracker*. She also choreographed for Grand Rapids Ballet since 2015 such as *Wave, Eriha, Death and Maiden, Tomorrow Never Comes* and *Chansons de Bilitis*. For the 2021 virtual season, Yuka had the opportunity to choreograph, direct and film her piece *sol and luna*.



JAY BATZNER - MUSIC ARRANGEMENT

Jay C. Batzner is currently on the faculty of Central Michigan University. He reads too many comic books and tries to find time for sewing and other various hobbies. Jay likes playing chess but loses a LOT of games. Jay's frequent interdisciplinary collaborations with choreographer Heather Trommer-Beardslee has led to several dance works based on student veterans, ecological succession, the Larry

During *The Wizard of Oz*, she has been responsible for all of the shows props and sets

THE STORY OF THE WIZARD OF OZ

Kansas

Young Dorothy lives on a small farm with her Uncle Henry, Auntie Em, and her dog Toto. Bored, Dorothy plays with her excitable dog. Miss Pitt, who owns Uncle Henry and Auntie Em's farm, stops by to collect the mortgage payment. When they are unable to pay, Miss Pitt threatens to take Toto.

Cyclone

The sky turns gray and Uncle Henry warns everyone that a cyclone is coming. Auntie Em motions for Dorothy to get inside the cellar for safety. As Dorothy reaches the open cellar door, Toto leaps out of Dorothy's arms and runs away. Dorothy chases after him, but it is too late. The whole house starts to spin as it becomes engulfed in the cyclone.

Munchkin Land

Dorothy opens her eyes to see the sun beaming through the windows. With Toto under her arm, she opens the door and is greeted by a group of curious people – the Munchkins. Glinda explains that Dorothy's house has landed on the Wicked Witch of the East. Dorothy tells Glinda that she just wants to go home, so Glinda tells Dorothy to go see the Wizard in Emerald City for help. Dorothy is given the Wicked Witch of the East's shoes (which fit perfectly) and she is sent down the yellow brick road to Emerald City.

Yellow Brick Road

Dorothy and Toto come upon a field where a lone scarecrow hangs on a perch. She isn't very good at scaring away crows because she does not have a brain to think. The Scarecrow shares that all she wants is a brain to be able to think for herself. Dorothy invites the Scarecrow to come with her to see if the powerful Wizard can help her too! Later on, they hear something that sounds like a cry. They come upon a rusted tin statue that asks to be oiled. The Tin Person shares that long ago she had

fallen in love with a Munchkin, but their young love was forbidden and her heart was taken away. She wishes to have a heart again, so Dorothy invites her to join the group to see the powerful Wizard. As they travel through a magical forest, they hear a noise and a Lion jumps out! Dorothy thumps the lion's nose, and she cowers in fright. She admits that all she wants is to be a fierce, roaring Lion. Dorothy invites her to join them on their journey to Emerald City as well.

Poppies

The travelers come upon a field of poppies. The Wicked Witch of the West has cast a spell on the poppies, making them emit a poisonous aroma that will cause everyone to fall asleep. The Poppy Flowers dance around them emitting the poison. But Glinda casts a different spell that makes snow appear, clearing the poppy poison from the air. The travelers awake and continue on their journey.

Emerald City

Dorothy and her traveling friends enter the surreal green city. Inside the Emerald Palace, each traveler makes their requests of the Wizard, who says he will grant them, but only if they defeat the Wicked Witch of the West first. With no choice, they decide that they must go and try to defeat the witch.

Witch's Forest

As the travelers pass through a dark forest, the Wicked Witch of the West sends wicked ravens, but the Scarecrow fights them off. Then she sends a swarm of bees, which are defeated by the Tin Person. In desperation, the witch grabs the winged monkeys' golden staff and orders them to pick up the travelers and bring them to her castle. Unable to fight off all the winged monkeys, Dorothy and the Lion are transported to the witch's castle.

Witch's Castle

The Wicked Witch and Dorothy fight over Dorothy's shoes, and just as the witch claims one of them, Dorothy throws a pail of water over her. The witch melts into a puddle on the floor. Dorothy collects the shoes, broom, and golden staff. As she grabs the staff, the winged monkeys appear and grant her three wishes, so Dorothy asks them to return her group to Emerald City.

Emerald City

Back in the Emerald Palace, Toto opens a cylinder to reveal an elderly man, who has been pretending to be the Wizard. He quickly explains that he arrived in Oz by balloon many years ago and became the ruler of the land of Oz. He confesses that he has no special powers, but gives each friend a symbolic item to show they already had the quality they desired. As the Wizard and Dorothy are about to lift off in the balloon to return home, Toto jumps out, and Dorothy chases after him. As the balloon and Wizard sail away without them, Glinda tells the crying Dorothy to click her heels three times, spin around, and make a wish to go home, which Dorothy does.

Kansas

Upon returning to the farm in Kansas, Dorothy is so excited to see Uncle Henry and Auntie Em again that she throws herself into their arms, vowing to never complain about her simple life or boring farm, ever again.
